From the Writer-Director

If this is the first time you've seen Mayhem in June, fear not - you aren't alone. This production marks Mayhem in June's inaugural performance and my theatrical debut as a writer and composer.

I wrote this show when I was seventeen in response to a troubling trend I noticed in high schools. People often draw conclusions from limited information, then force their conclusions on others. The result is many different versions of the same events are spread, and the truth gets lost amidst it.

In 2023, the Beenleigh Theatre Group graciously supported workshops of this show, an invaluable help that led to a complete restructuring of the story, as well as several new songs (if you can't guess the new ones, ask me after). Then, I was thrilled to receive the financial support of Logan City Council through the Regional Arts Development Fund to produce the show this year. I am eternally grateful for the generosity of these organisations for giving me the chance to hone my craft and experiment with something brand new.

Mayhem in June follows Peter, a Year 11 student who has moved to a new school and is looking to reinvent himself. He settles into a friend group and gets caught up in a web of school club politics about who will be the Chess and Choir Captains, but when June comes, everything that matters to him is at stake.

Rehearsals for this show have been a massive learning curve for me as well as it is also my debut as a director. Because the show explores Peter's tendency to overthinh things, I wanted the stage to feel like we are inside his head, littered with chess pieces, songs and thoughts of other people popping in and out. He is dependent on a notebook to organise his thoughts, so that sits at the centre of the room, with pages from each month projected overhead. The stage, as I feel compelled to write by the presence of my high school drama teacher Bradley Chapman overseeing these notes, exists in a "liminal space."

Finally, I will mention the music. Each song is packed with fast lyrics and intricate melodic ideas, an acknowledgement of the complexity involved in social interactions, and a testament to the incredible skills and effort of this phenomenal cast and band. Creating this musical has been an absolute privilege at every stage, and I am thrilled to finally share these silly little songs and characters that have been such a huge part of my life for so long now.
